






MEASUREMENT FRAMEWORK FOR THE ESTIMATION OF CHILD LABOUR






Child labour in includes economic activities by children that has been prohibited either because of their age or because of the nature of the tasks involved. If a child starts work too early, work for excessive hours, or undertakes work that impacts their physical or mental health, development, or schooling, this constitutes child labour.







Almost 3 in 5 children in child labour are too young to work, and 2 are engaged in hazardous work.



Children are mostly found in child labour in the **fetching water and gathering firewood and agriculture sector**.



- Child work in agriculture sector
- Child work in indusrty sector
- Child work in services sector
- Children work in fetching water or gathering firewood
- Children in unpaid trainee work or domestic sector

Boys are more likely to be involved in child labour and in hazardous work than girls at any age.




Most of children in child labour live in **rural** areas.





Hazardous child labour is work which jeopardises the health, safety or morals of a child. This includes work such as construction, mining, work involving dangerous chemicals, heavy machinery, alcohol or ilicit activities.

Boys are more likely to engage in hazardous work than girls.



Most children are working in hazardous conditions, with large domestic animals (e.g., camels, cattle), or around animal manure (e.g., manure pits).



Most of children in hazardous work live in **rural** areas.



Almost 7 in 10 children engaged in hazardous work were considered occupations, of which 1.2 thousand (2.0% of total child labour) of them took part in races and help the trainers take care of the racehorses.


CHILDREN IN ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES

Children in economic activities include 5 to 17 years olds who participate in activities within the SNA production boundary for at least 1 hour in the reference week. Not all children are in child labour.

Of the children aged 5-17 years, 24.4 percent



Boys are more likely to engage in children's economic activities than girls.


Almost 2 out of 3 working children do so to produce goods that the family will consume.






Children's involvement in economic activities has a negative impact on children's involvement in education.

Most of them are children aged 5-12 years.



SDG indicator 8.7.1 Proportion of children aged 5-17 years engaged in child labour: The Percentage of working children among children aged 5-17 was 7.4% in 2012 and increased in the last 10 years to 16.2% in 2022.
